ICCB BOARD GOALS

DEFINITIONAL CHANGES

Career Pathway Definition

- A career pathway means a combination of rigorous and high-quality education, training, and other services that aligns both vertically and horizontally across Secondary Education, Adult Education, Workforce Training and Development, Career and Technical Education, and Postsecondary Education systems, pathways, and programs.
- Collaborative partnerships with these entities and business and industry, along with human service agencies, corrections, and other community stakeholders, serve as the foundational structure for high-quality and sustainable career pathways. A career pathway also includes multiple entry and exit points to facilitate individuals to build their skills as they progress along a continuum of education and training and advance in sector-specific employment.

CAREER PATHWAY ELEMENTS

- (A) Aligns with the skill needs of industries in the economy of the State or regional economy involved;
- (B) Prepares an individual to be successful in any of a full range of secondary or postsecondary education options, including apprenticeships registered under the National Apprenticeship Act.2
- (C) Includes counseling to support an individual in achieving the individual's education and career goals;
- (D) Includes, as appropriate, education offered concurrently with and in the same context as workforce preparation activities5 and training for a specific occupation or occupational cluster



CAREER PATHWAY ELEMENTS

(E) Organizes education, training, and other services to meet the particular needs of an individual in a manner that accelerates the educational and career advancement of the individual to the extent practicable;

(F) Enables an individual to attain a secondary school diploma or its recognized equivalent, and at least 1 recognized postsecondary credential; and

G) Helps an individual enter or advance within a specific occupation or occupational cluster.

ADULT EDUCATION UPDATE

- Updated Adult Education Legislation
 - Adult Education and WIOA Updates
 - Switch to Public Community College Act
 - Changes \$3.00 to \$6.00 per unit of instruction
 - \$30.00 maximum
 - Public Assistance Students are exempt
- High School Diploma for Adult Learners
 - Legislation and JCAR Rules developed
 - Section 3-15.12a of the School Code [105 ILCS 5] provides eligible applicants with a process for attaining the authority to award a high school diploma to adult learners. This Part sets forth the rules for eligible applicants to apply for approval from the Illinois Community College Board to award a high school diploma to adult learners
