FALL 2011 OPENING ENROLLMENT SURVEY RESULTS

Statewide Results. While the latest enrollment figures are down from recent record levels, overall opening Fall 2011 enrollments reflect a strong demand for the courses delivered by Illinois community colleges. For Fall 2011, both headcount and full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollments are at their third highest level in over a quarter of a century.

Systemwide at the beginning of Fall 2011, there were 371,898 students enrolled at Illinois Community Colleges in credit coursework. The number of students enrolling in credit courses at Illinois community colleges as of the end of regular registration for Fall 2011 was 7,838 fewer (-2.1 percent) than in Fall 2010. Statewide Fall 2011 headcount enrollments remain above the five year average Fall headcount.

Community colleges educate and train many part-time students. FTE figures reflect the total number of credit hours being taken by students divided by 15 which is the number of semester hours traditionally considered a full-time class load. The Full-time Equivalent (FTE) enrollment was 218,082 in Fall 2011. Statewide FTE enrollments are down the equivalent of 6,592 full-time students (FTE -2.9 percent) from Fall 2010. The latest Fall FTE enrollments are above the five year average Fall FTE.

These opening enrollments reflect the end of the regular fall registration period which is usually the 10th day of class. These preliminary counts are from the internet based Fall 2011 Enrollment Survey. Results are verified as the detailed Fall Enrollment (E1) data submissions are finalized.

Table 1 provides system wide comparative fall census enrollment counts for the last five years. Statewide opening headcount enrollments decreased slightly for the second consecutive year. This year's statewide FTE enrollment decrease marks the first time in the last five years where FTE enrollments declined.

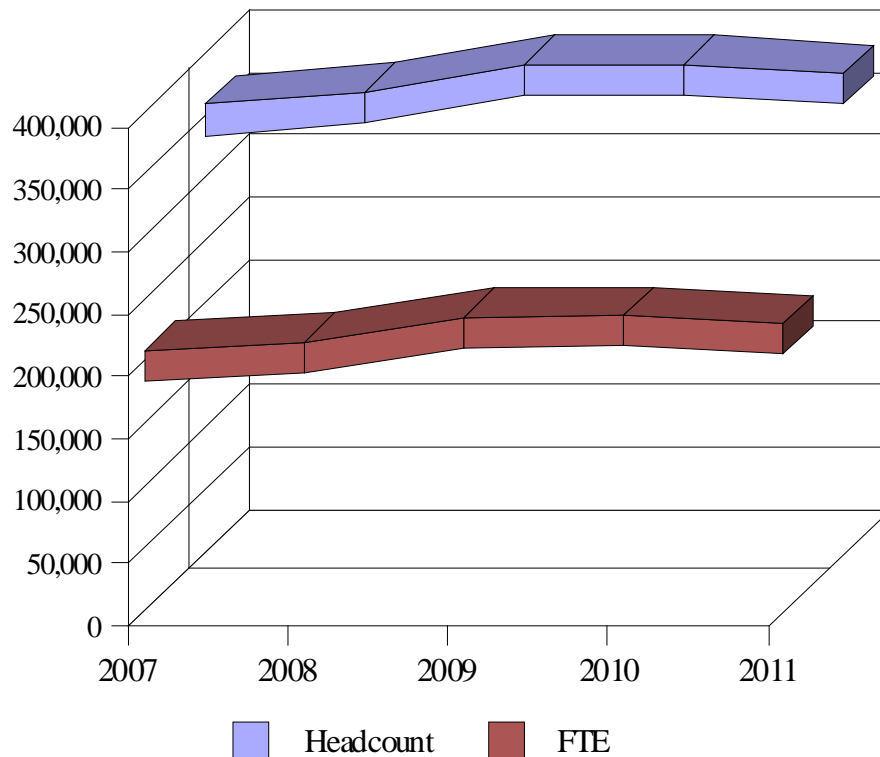


Figure 1: Opening Fall Headcount and FTE Enrollment, 2007-2011

Results by College. The externally attached Table 2 provides comparative information by college for Fall 2007 through 2011 headcount enrollments. A one-year comparison between Fall 2010 and Fall 2011 among the 48 community colleges shows that there were four colleges with enrollment decreases for every college that reported an enrollment gain. Thirty-five colleges reported headcount decreases of one percent or more. Four colleges exhibited headcount enrollment increases of one percent or above. The remaining nine colleges experienced little or no change (less than one percent).

The externally attached Table 3 provides college level comparative data on FTE enrollments for the most recent five-year period. Over the past year, FTE decreases were posted by 37 colleges and 7 colleges reported increases. Four colleges experienced little or no change in FTE.

Students in Correctional Facilities. Six Illinois community colleges furnished instructional services to correctional facilities during the Fall semester of both 2010 and 2011. The externally attached Table 4 provides a comparison of correctional and non-correctional 2010 and 2011 Fall headcount enrollment for each community college. In the latest data, there were 3,366 students in correctional facilities which accounts for 0.9 percent of the statewide headcount. Proportionately this was up slightly from Fall 2010. An examination of only student enrollments in correctional facilities reveals a headcount increase of 33.3 percent (N = +840). **Non**-correctional headcount enrollment decreased (-2.3 percent, N = -8,678) from Fall 2010 to Fall 2011.

The externally attached Table 5 shows a comparison of FTE enrollment – correctional and non-correctional students – for Fall 2010 and Fall 2011 by community college. Students in correctional facilities accounted for 0.6 percent (N = 1,381) of the overall FTE enrollment in Fall 2011 which is proportionately higher than Fall 2010 (0.5 percent). An examination of only student enrollments in correctional facilities shows that incarcerated student FTE was higher than last year (14.1 percent or N = 171 FTE) and outpaced the enrollment declines in non-correctional population enrollments (-3.0 percent or N = -6,763 FTE).

Internet Enrollment by College. On-line instruction is an important part of the delivery of instructional programs in the community college system. Fall 2011 is the fourth year that internet enrollments have been reported from all colleges in the Opening Fall Enrollment Survey. The externally attached Tables 6 and 7 provide unduplicated and duplicated headcount internet enrollment for Fall 2008 through Fall 2011. There were 91,882 duplicated internet enrollments and 60,096 unduplicated internet enrollments for Fall 2011. Duplicated internet headcount enrollments decreased -1.6 percent (-1,479) from Fall 2010. Similarly, Fall 2011 unduplicated internet enrollments decreased -1.5 percent with - 938 fewer students than Fall 2010. Based on unduplicated beginning of term counts, in Fall 2011 internet headcount enrollments (unduplicated) accounted for 16.2 percent of overall headcount enrollments which is about the same as last year (16.1 percent).

Table 8 provides opening internet FTE enrollments for Fall 2008 through Fall 2011. There were 18,970 internet FTE enrollments in Fall 2011 which is similar to Fall 2010 (+0.4 percent or +68 FTE). In Fall 2011, internet FTE enrollments accounted for 8.7 percent of overall opening FTE enrollments which is similar to Fall 2010 (8.4 percent).

Each of the Fall 2011 internet enrollment counts – duplicated headcount, unduplicated headcount and FTE -- are all nearly ten percent above their corresponding 4 year average.

Additional Background. Fall opening enrollment information for credit-generating students are recorded by the colleges at the end of the regular fall registration period, which is typically the 10th day of class. Opening fall enrollment data are gathered from postsecondary institutions nationwide. Historically, these counts provide a "snapshot" of opening fall term enrollment for year-to-year and institution-to-institution comparisons. The diversity of the community college system and its students is not fully captured in these opening enrollment snapshot data. Community college flexible scheduling (e.g., modules, other intensive late start classes, etc.) is necessary to accommodate student schedules and compete successfully in the marketplace. Hence, enrollment trends are more fully captured through use of annual data.
