FISCAL YEAR 2008 SPRING ENROLLMENT REPORT

Community colleges report opening Spring term enrollment figures to the Illinois Community College Board via a brief web based survey. These figures reflect only those students enrolled in credit courses that were operational on the census date (last day for course registration for regular classes). Enrollment for classes beginning after the census date are reflected in the annual enrollment counts. The following short report summarizes these survey results.

This report contains information on student enrollments as of the end of registration – usually the 10th day of the term – for the Spring 2008 semester. Overall, statewide results of the fiscal year 2008 Spring enrollment survey show relative continuity compared to last year. Statewide Spring 2008 **headcount enrollments decreased slightly** and full-time equivalent (**FTE enrollments increased**) compared with the same term one year ago. The Spring 2008 semester headcount was 351,777 compared to 353,735 last year (a headcount decrease of -1,958 or -0.6 percent). The latest FTE count was 194,594 compared with 191,976 a year ago (an FTE increase of 2,618 or 1.4 percent).

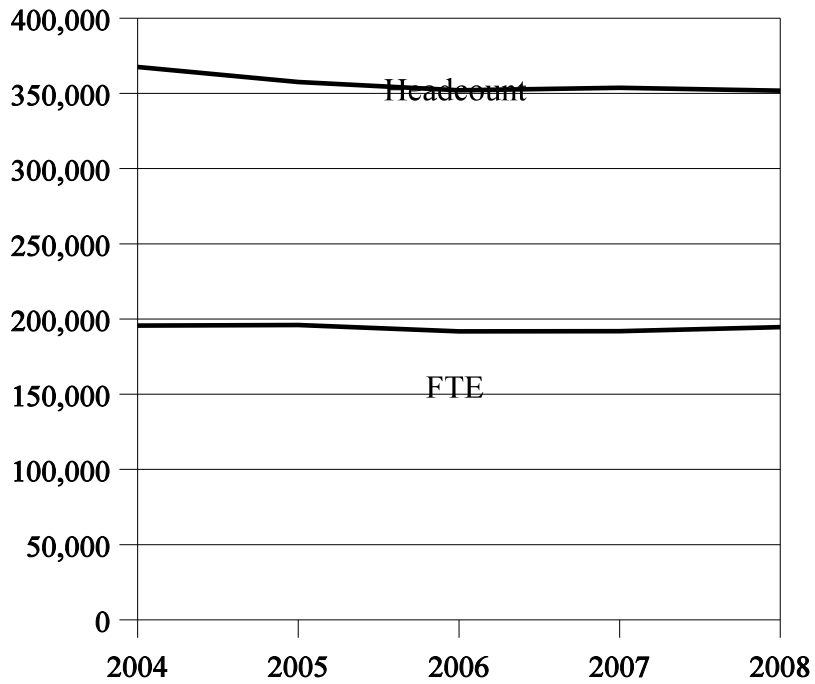


Fig.1. Spring Term Headcount and FTE Enrollment, 2004-2008

Table 1 contains comparative statewide Spring 2008 tenth-day enrollments for the last five years. Current systemwide headcount enrollments are below the average of the last four years. Systemwide FTE enrollments registered an increase this year and remain slightly below the 2004 FTE enrollment level. Current FTE enrollments are above the average of the last four years. Figure 1 on the next page illustrates a comparison of headcount and FTE trends from 2004 - 2008.

Table 2 provides a comparison of fiscal year 2004 through fiscal year 2008 Spring headcount enrollments for each community college. Among the 48 community colleges, since last year headcount increases were reported at 15 colleges (1.0 percent or higher), while 22 colleges exhibited decreases (1.0 percent or more) compared to last year. Eleven colleges reported little or no change (less than 1.0 percent) versus last year.

Table 3 contains a comparison of full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollments for the same five-year period. Compared to last year, FTE advances lead declines as Spring 2008 FTE increases were reported by 23 colleges, decreases by 18, and 7 colleges indicated little or no change.
