We are not automatically awarding certificates and degrees. Students still complete a graduation application. We are; however, looking at this option through data analysis. I am very interested in hearing from other institutions regarding the process and whether or not they have automatic degree awards.

ICC does not have such a process. Students are required to apply for certificate awarding as they are for the degree. Obviously, this is something that is being evaluated for possible change.

Ours is not automatic processing. We call it automatic because the student doesn't have to apply for the certificates, but we do it all manually using Batch Processing to evaluate.

This is currently something we are working on as well.

For the spring term we sent out letters to those that had applied for degrees saying if they were eligible for the certificate we would automatically award them unless we heard from them. We ended up processing an additional 70 plus certificates. We are only catching those that apply for degrees at this point. But the ad-hoc committee has made the recommendation that we run an update once or twice a year to process those that have completed and not applied. This is still a work in process at the moment.

Kishwaukee College evaluates student coursework once an application for graduation is completed and does automatically award all degrees and certificates a student has earned.

At Oakton, we do automatically award certificates to our students once per year during the summer semester. We have awarded an average of 600 additional certificates. We notify the students electronically.

We do not automatically award certificates; students still do a graduation application.

At Rock Valley we complete the following steps:

- Print a custom report from Datatel to capture students taking courses related to a specific certificate.
- Manually go through each student to see if they meet the certificate requirements. The custom report doesn't show those that have completed.
- We then auto-award certificate completers in the system but do not send printed certificates to the students without an application on file.
- Lastly, we document in the system who was an auto-completer versus an applicant, so the auto-completers would not be charged for a reprint because they did not originally apply to receive the certificate.

For RVC, this process is mostly manual and takes staff time to locate completers.

- Administratively Awarded Degrees/Certificates (forced)
- We use SCT BANNER
- We identify "capstone" courses for each program.
- Our Technical Support Programmer and our SCT BANNER Specialist developed a report identifying currently enrolled students who have taken a capstone course and then compares the students' academic records against those programs and against all catalogs built in Banner.
- The report of possible "awards" is sent to the registrar for confirmation. - - The registrar verifies catalog and confirms requirements. If acceptable the degree or certificate is awarded.
- The diploma is generated and is set to the student with the following letter:

Dear Student:

For several years now, Sauk Valley Community College has attempted to identify those students who have completed program requirements but did not file an "Intent to Graduate" to have the certificates or degrees awarded.

Congratulations! A review of our records indicates that you have met the course requirements for the enclosed certificate or degree. Please note this award in no way affects any pending or previously awarded certificates or degrees.

We have been doing this since 2003. We only charge a commencement participation fee and not a graduation fee.
