Vice President for Student Services Lake Land College	At Lake Land, we have a variety of scheduling options but our core full-semester schedule is based on: Tuesday/Thursday Day 8-9:15 a.m., 9:30-10:45 a.m., 11 a.m12:15 p.m., 12:30-1:45 p.m., 2-3:15 p.m., 4-5:15 p.m. Monday/Wednesday/Friday Day 50 minute periods beginning at 8, 9, 10, 1, 2, 3, 4 <i>NOTE</i> : Wednesday from 11 a.m1 p.m. is designated as the Student Activity Period. We have free events/ intramural activities for students each week. This is also the time that student clubs meet and faculty/staff schedule meetings. 11a.m. and 12 p.m. classes are generally scheduled Monday/Tuesday/Friday <b>or</b> Monday/Thursday/Friday
	Evening classes are generally scheduled to meet one evening per week from 6:30-9:15 p.m. Demand for evening courses has really decreased as Internet enrollment has increased.
Amy Diaz Rock Valley College	The RVC schedule matrix is attached ( <i>Note</i> : tabs at bottom show different ways of scheduling courses for summer terms vs. fall/spring). We changed ours two years ago now to account for a standard amount of passing time (15 minutes). The typical patterns are: M/W  or  T/TH from 7:30 – 8:45 a.m. 9:00 – 10:15 a.m. 10:30 – 11:45 a.m. 12:00 – 11:15 p.m. 1:30 – 2:45 p.m. 3:00 – 4:15 p.m. 4:30 – 5:45 p.m. 6:00 – 7:15 p.m. 7:30 – 8:45 p.m. 9:00 – 10:15 p.m. 7:30 – 8:45 p.m. 9:00 – 10:15 p.m. And, there may be some courses that run for four or five days per week for 50 minutes each meeting. We try to start or end those according to the schedule matrix (e.g., 10:30 – 11:20 a.m., M – F). And, of course, there are 1 day per week courses that run for 2 hours and 45 minutes. They could be scheduled on any day of the week but likely a Friday only (e.g., 9 – 11:45 a.m.) or in the evenings usually from 6 – 8:45 p.m.

	Ideally, this allows for Friday scheduling to be one day per week <u>OR</u> to use Fridays for hybrid course offerings with f2f times on Fridays and the rest of the course delivery is online.

Guy Goodman Dean of Student Services Illinois Central College	ICC's scheduling format is as follows: Monday/Wednesday/Friday: start on the hour and last 50 minutes Tuesday/Thursday start at 8:00 am and every 1:30 thereafter and last 1:15 minutes (ie. 8:00 to 9:15, 9:30 to 10:45, etc.) Two day per week classes may also start at varying times and last for a varying amount of time depending on the number of credit hours One day per week evening courses will typically last 2:45, starting at 5:30 or 6:00 pm
Dr. Tracy Morris Associate VP Student Services Illinois Valley Community College	We are very similar at IVCC—except we never got the buy-in for keeping the noon hour open for activities. Our schedule is basically Full-semester schedule: Tuesday/Thursday Day 8-9:15, 9:30-10:45, 11-12:15, 12:30-1:45, 2-3:15 (very few 2-3:15 classes) Monday/Wednesday/Friday Day 50 minute periods beginning at 8, 9, 10, 1, 2 Limited number of MW classes—usually 1-2:15 or a regular 50 minute time slot with a blended option. We discourage these because it creates a room scheduling issue.
	Evening classes are generally scheduled to meet one evening per week from 6:30-9:15. However, some start at 5:30, some start at 6—some go later than 9:15. All depends on time needed for contact or lab hours. The only advice I have is that whatever you do, try to stick to that schedule. We allow faculty to select their teaching times for the most part and when they go outside of these set times, we have issues making schedules work from the student parametive

Our daytime schedule is, for the most part, structured hourly, with classes starting at the top of the hour, and assuming 50 minutes of instruction for each contact hour: 8:00 a.m. to 8:50 a.m. 9:00 a.m. to 9:50 a.m.

10:00 a.m. to 10:50 a.m. 11:00 a.m. to 11:50 a.m. 12:00 p.m. to 12:50 p.m. 1:00 p.m. to 1:50 p.m. 2:00 p.m. to 2:50 p.m. and so on.
Once you get to the latter part of the afternoon, the enrollment drops off significantly and one will find examples of varied scheduling, such as 3:30 p.m. to 5:20 p.m.
Our evening block is generally 6 p.m. to 7:50 p.m., 8:50 p.m. or 9:50 p.m., depending on whether the class meets for 2, 3 or 4 contact hours (assumes 50 minutes of instruction for each contact hour with 10 minute break between each contact hour).

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
