<p>Black Hawk College, East Campus</p> <p>Vashti Berry, Coordinator of Orientation and Student Life East Campus</p>	<p>Black Hawk College, East Campus</p> <p>Yes, we have a Student Game Room located off the cafeteria in our main building. Students utilize this room daily for socializing, sleeping, playing games, watching television, eating, etc. We also host third party student engagement events in our Game Room (usually 2-4 per semester).</p> <p>(Equipment on hand for students: 2 pool tables, 1 ping pong table, television, board games and card games)</p>
<p>Black Hawk College, Quad City Campus</p> <p>Erica Murphy</p>	<p>Black Hawk College, Quad City Campus</p> <p>Black Hawk College-Quad City Campus has a Student Recreation room that we call the Hawk's Nest. The Hawk's Nest offers similar functions as a student union, and is located in the middle building of our campus. This area consists of the top floor of the building and houses Subway, four conference rooms and a large gathers space for students. We offer a ping pong table, foosball table and a TV. Students eat, study, relax, and network in this location. Clubs/organizations and campus departments hold meetings in this area. This is also where the majority of our Student Activities and Events are held.</p>
<p>Carl Sandburg Community College</p> <p>Steve Norton</p>	<p>Sandburg does not have a recreation room on campus. We do have some ping pong tables that come out for special events as well as some other game type equipment that is also not available for use all of the time.</p>

<p>Elgin Community College</p> <p>Dr. Carol Cowles Dean of Student Services and Development</p>	<p>Do you have a student recreation room? We have 3 student lounges and a student dining area: one has a large television in it for viewing television programs. We have a gaming area with several large computer monitors set up for gaming. We refer to this area as “the Gamers’ Lounge. Student life has a few computer games that can be checked out for use in the Gamers Lounge. Additionally, cards and board games can be checked out from our Student Life Department and used in any space.</p> <p>What equipment/games are in the room? See Above</p> <p>Where is the room located on your campus? All lounges are in Building B adjacent to most Student Services and Student Life. There are other student gathering spaces, informally referred to as lounges in other buildings on campus but no equipment is installed or provisions for loaning are involved.</p> <p>How are students using this room? The Gamers’ Lounge is in constant use for computer games that students bring or borrow from Student Life. The two lounges are multi-purpose and used for dining as well as relaxation.</p>
<p>Heartland Community College</p> <p>Rick Pearce, Ph.D. Vice President for Learning and Student Success</p>	<p>We have a student lounge that has a pool table, X-Box, a number of computers (where we allow them to Facebook, etc.). It is located near the cafeteria and just across from the student life office. I don’t have any numbers on usage, but during the day it is pretty heavily used.</p>
<p>Highland Community College</p> <p>Liz Gerber</p>	<p>Do you have a student recreation room? As part of our student cafeteria, a portion of the room has games, TV, and a few computers.</p> <p>What equipment/games are in the room? Pool table, dart board, pin ball machine, foosball table.</p> <p>Where is the room located on your campus? Cafeteria (can be separated by a moving wall).</p> <p>How are students using this room? We're not sure. There is no monitoring. Although it feels</p>

	like a handful, the handful sure is unhappy when the pool table isn't working right.
<p>Illinois Central College Guy Goodman Vice President of Student Affairs</p>	ICC has a student lounge with game tables and a big screen TV. It is located immediately off the area where our student activities meet on the third floor (above the cafeteria). Students use the area for relaxation, studying and general gathering. Our student activities will have programming in the area at specific times of the year.
<p>John Wood Community College Mike Elbe</p>	John Wood Community College does not have a student recreation room. We have student lounges with TV's and lounging areas.
<p>Lewis and Clark Community College Kent Scheffel Vice President Enrollment Services</p>	We do not have a student rec room.
<p>Moraine Valley Community College Dr. Normah Salleh-Barone Vice President for Student Development</p>	<p>Do you have a student recreation room? Yes</p> <p>What equipment/games are in the room? Two video game areas (for Wii and Xbox); miniature basketball shoot; air hockey; ping pong table; dart board (soft-tip)</p> <p>Where is the room located on your campus? In the Student Life area (Student Union)</p> <p>How are students using this room? Video games are the biggest hit with air hockey and ping pong being used frequently. Many students hang out to socialize while friends are playing games.</p>
<p>Parkland College Linda Moore</p>	No student rec room at Parkland; there hasn't been for years.

<p>Rock Valley College</p> <p>Amy Diaz</p>	<p>Do you have a student recreation room? – Yes.</p> <p>What equipment/games are in the room? – TV, tables, chairs; board games; no pool tables, etc. – we used to have these types of games but removed them several years ago.</p> <p>Where is the room located on your campus? – In the Student Center.</p> <p>How are students using this room? – Hang out space, watching TV, reading magazines, using their laptops, etc.</p>
<p>Sauk Valley Community College</p> <p>Luis Moreno</p>	<p>We do not have a "rec room" at SVCC. We do have a large cafeteria that has a piano, two ping pong tables, a pool table, and a foosball table. It is not your typical cafeteria. It looks more like a student rec area since it has a lot of seating and it is carpeted. Students use it as a lounge area.</p>
<p>Spoon River College</p> <p>Randy Greenwell</p>	<p>Do you have a student recreation room? Yes, we have one at each campus and the two centers.</p> <p>What equipment/games are in the room? Air hockey, ping pong, at the Canton Campus they also have pinball machines.</p> <p>Where is the room located on your campus? Lower level by the cafeteria.</p> <p>How are students using this room? I don't have a count but they are almost always in use.</p>
<p>Triton College</p> <p>Quincy Martin III, Ed.D. Associate Vice President, Student Affairs</p>	<p>Triton College does not have a student recreation room.</p>

<p>William Rainey Harper College</p> <p>Ashley B. Knight, Ed. D. Dean, Student Affairs</p>	<p>Do you have a student recreation room? Harper College does not have a designated “Student Recreation Room;” however, the Third Floor Student Activities Lounge serves as a “limited recreation space.”</p> <p>What equipment/games are in the room? Currently in the space are three (3) coin-operated billiards tables, three (3) chess/checkers tables, and numerous other tables and chairs for students to play board games on. In the past, we have had 2 -3 video arcade games; however, they were removed due to lack of use. There is also a bank of six (6) open-access computers and some lounge furniture.</p> <p>Where is the room located on your campus? The lounge space is located on the Third Floor of the Student Center, directly outside of the Office of Student Activities. This allows staff to monitor student behavior.</p> <p>How are students using this room? The students are using the space as a primary gathering location in-between class. There is a regular audience of “gamers” who frequent the space and utilize the open tables for their board games. There is also a rotating audience of general students who use the pool tables and chess/checker boards. The space is in frequent use with between 15-30 students gathering at any one time.</p>
